Yesterday we ministered in KwaZenzele with some visitors who attend Elijah Ministries, the Moriel affiliated church in Johannesburg. The Gospel was preached and people were ministered to one on one. They didn't make a decision to follow the Lord then but they have the details of the church and we hope that they will visit us. The Elijah crowd led the singing and their voices were just beautiful.

As most of you know, our friend Sam died in hospital. The funeral was held a couple of Saturdays ago and the Gospel of sin, repentance, the cross, the blood and the resurrection was preached. African funerals are different to western ones in that the singing is spontaneous. No hymns are pre-picked but a couple of ladies will start singing and everybody else will join in. The whole service was in Zulu apart from the sermon which was preached in Zulu and translated into English. Ebyown very kindly provided Lorraine with assistance in funeral costs and food. This was so important as it meant that Lorraine didn't have to go into debt in order to cover the costs and provide for her family.

In the last week of March we will be staying in the Ebyown house while Lyn and Chris Royle head over to the UK in order to attend Aaron's

wedding. We just wish Aaron and Erin all the best for the day. We love you and wish we could have attended. We know that you will keep your eyes on the Lord. In April we will be moving into Allen and Sue Well's home (they run Bezaleel) and use the time to prepare and focus on the move.

For everybody who has prayed and shared the burden, we just want to say thank you. We thank the Lord for His goodness towards us and His faithfulness in guiding us and keeping us.
